As we celebrate our 50th anniversary, we reflect on a remarkable journey that began in 1974 just after the passage of Roe v. Wade. Our organization has steadfastly upheld feminist values and reaffirmed our commitment to justice, equity, and powersharing with everyone we serve, regardless of gender identity, sexual orientation, age, race, ethnicity, income, or any other circumstance. Our evolution from a women's health collective to now having three robust, fully integrated primary care community health centers in Santa Cruz, Live Oak, and most recently in Ben Lomond, has been key to our resilience.

This past year, we emerged stronger than ever from the aftermath of COVID-19. We implemented a new electronic health record system that enhances our ability to modernize and streamline patient care, improve communication, and strengthen coordination with our community partners. We proudly welcomed our inaugural class of eight family practice medicine residents in partnership

with Dignity CommonSpirit and Morehouse College School of Medicine and made significant strides toward our vision of an expanded downtown clinic.

As we reflect on these transformative years and look forward to the future, we remain committed to our mission of improving the health of our patients and the community and advocating the feminist goals of social, political, and economic equality. Our journey is a testament to the power of community, collaboration, and unwavering dedication to social justice and healthcare for all. Santa Cruz Community Health is embarking on a transformative journey to dramatically expand healthcare access in downtown Santa Cruz. Through our new facility at Pacific Station South, we will create a vibrant destination for the whole family to access whole-person health care.

This expansion will allow us to serve **3,000 additional patients,** bringing our total Downtown capacity to **7,000 community members** through almost **40,000 patient visits annually.**

This strategic expansion, located next to the county's largest transportation hub, will integrate comprehensive medical care, behavioral health and social services under one roof.



More than a medical facility, this new health center represents our commitment to addressing the critical healthcare gaps in our community. By combining healthcare services with proximity to over 70 new affordable housing units, we're creating an innovative model that recognizes health happens where people live, work and play.

This investment in our community's future will ensure that our most vulnerable neighbors—including children, seniors and families—have access to high-quality, comprehensive healthcare in a location that's accessible to all. As we've done for over 50 years, Santa Cruz Community Health continues to pave the way toward a healthier, more equitable Santa Cruz County.
